No exclusions or waivers apply or may be granted by the director of Ohio EPA, as outlined by OAC Rule 3745-1-05. The public hearing will end when all interested parties have had an opportunity to provide testimony related to the project. Ohio EPA will continue to accept written comments on the application and DRAFT certification through the close of business on March 10, 2017.
